

# **Most Recognized Switch**





### **Pal Pads**

- Can be plugged into <u>ANY</u> communication aid or battery-operated assistive device
- Only need 1.2 ounces of force to activate
- 3 sizes
- Easily attach objects and textures
- Great for activities
  - Adapting books
  - Attaching to cases





# **Pal Pads**Glow-in-the-Dark

- Can be used just like an ordinary Pal Pad or in darkness.
- Only need 1.2 ounces of force to activate.
- 2 sizes (Large, Small)
- Recharge for 5-10 minutes under incandescent or fluorescent light.
- Charge lasts 15-45 minutes.

## **Pneumatic Switch**

- Activates with a puff of air
- Great way to make an object-based switch
- Can use squeeze toys, balls or bottles













# **Flexible Switch**

- Flat switch
- Adhesive-backed
- Pressure switch
- Works great in wheelchair headrests
- Flexible to the diameter of a coffee cup













# **SwitchBoard**

- Six switches in one confined area
- Each activation area is 4" x 5"
- 2 ounces of pressure to activate

• Can be used with any device that has 1/8<sup>th</sup>-inch






## Six Pack

- Six switches in one confined area
- Each activation area approximately 2"x2"
- 1.2 ounces of pressure to activate
- Can be used with any device that has 1/8<sup>th</sup> inch jacks












# **Taction Pads**

- Reusability
- Durability
- Sensitivity
- Can be cut!

## **Bright Box and Bright Box Tactile**



- Pressure switches
- Great for low vision or night time use
- Multiple function combinations
- Surface dimension approximately 4"x2"








### **Dipsy**

- Tilt-sensitive switch
- Activated by a 30-degree tilt
- Can be used with any device that has a standard 1/8<sup>th</sup>-inch jack







# Honey Bee Proximity Switch

- Activated by placing hand, head or object over sensor window.
- Plugs into ANY communication aid, toy or computer switch interface.
- 3 ranges: 6", 3", 1", 0" (touch)
- Uses common battery (CR2032)
- Long battery life.
- 30" cord






# **LinkSwitch**


- Is a duel switch/latch timer
- Multiple modes of operation
- Compatible with any standard switch

#### **Breakdown of Communication**

#### 55% Visual

- Things we see like:
  - Gestures
  - Facial Expressions
  - Body Movement
  - Objects in the Environment

#### 37% Vocal

- Vocal Intonation
- Rate
- Intensity or Volume

#### 7% Verbal

- BlissSymbolics
- Text



# Single Message















## **Sequencing**

The ability to pre-record a series of messages and control the order in which they are played back

#### **RANDOMIZING**

The ability to control the recorded vocabulary set but not the play-back order




Sequencing and Randomizing should be used for Expressive *and* Receptive language activities!

### **Sequencer Features**

- Single-message!
- 2 Independent Levels
- 90 seconds of record time per level
- External switch jack for access or to enhance visual cueing
- Relay/Toy jack
- External speaker jack
- Simple to record
- Auditory Cue (beeping)













## Hot Chocolate Recipe Ingredients: Directions: 1. Wash your hands. Open packet of cocoa. 3. Pour packet in mug. 4. Pour water in mug 5. Put mug in microwave. 6. Choose cooking time (about 1 minute). 7. Start microwave. 8. Carefully remove mug. 9. Stir until smooth. 10. Drink and clean up.



## **Randomizer Features**

- 2 Independent Levels
  - Single-message mode
  - Jumble mode
  - Eliminator mode
- 90 seconds of record time per level
- External switch jack for access or to enhance visual cueing
- Relay/Toy jack
- External speaker jack
- Simple to record














#### **Medley Features**

- Sequencing & Randomizing
  - Accessed through external switch (plug in and go!)
- On-board keypad
- 8 external switch jacks
- 90 seconds of record time
- Visual cues via overlay
- Automatic message playback after recording
- Simple to record (record in any order)













#### **VoicePal Levels Features**

- Sequencing & Randomizing
  - Accessed through external switch (plug in and go!)
  - One or two-button
- On-board keypad
- 2, 3, 5 or 10 messages
- 10 external switch jacks
- 4 Levels
- 17.5 minutes of record time
- Visual cues via overlay and lights
- Automatic message playback after recording
- Simple to record (record in any order)
- Scanning
